MINUTES

Opening worship and prayer

Rich opened the meeting in prayer before a time of sung worship. Everyone was invited to write down what they are thankful to God for in the life of the church over the past year (see appendix 1)

Annual Meeting of Parishioners

Both Jenny and Phil stood unopposed and were duly elected churchwardens until the APCM of 2024. The meeting showed appreciation with applause! Jo and Fraser led the church in prayer for them and their families.

(iv) Receipt of Annual Report and Accounts 2022 and Annual Review 2022

Rich referred the participants to the Annual Review available on the website and in print by request.

a. Electoral Roll report

At the APCM on 4th April 2022 the roll stood at 177. Since then, 23 names have been added and 13 names have been removed. Today the electoral roll stands at 187. The roll is available to view on the website as well as up on the church notice board.

b. Treasurer's report

Church Finance Update

We are in the storm and there is more to come! Overall charity funds have improved for the 4^{th} year running; total reserves increased by £175K to £558k. However, the General Fund and Designated funds have suffered a reduction of £6.6K. The PCC has maintained control of the budget during 2022 and General Fund expenditure was almost £20K below budget, but we missed our income target by £54K.

In 2022 the PCC planned to balance the budget as part of our five-year plan to become financially sustainable as a resourcing church. Income fell below target and the PCC has had to make some difficult decisions to minimise the deficit in 2022. £8k of our giving to external mission has been deferred until we have the cash available to be reinstated as soon as possible.

The Making Room for Campaign was launched in February 2023 aiming to get us back on track: we still plan to sustain our mission as a local church, meet our obligations as resourcing church, become self-funded by 2026 (when the resourcing church funding ends), and enable our mission and staff team to continue.

Worcester Foodbank Update

God has been at work in 2022! Foodbank funds have flourished, growing by £250K. However, we spent £250K on running costs and purchase of food. 106 tonnes of food donations valued at over £245K were distributed.

Foodbank is in a strong position to serve the community and rapidly growing demand. Grahame thanked everyone for their ongoing generosity.

Grahame thanked the finance team for their work, asked the church to pray and invited questions. Q: why do we have an organ fund when it is used so rarely?

A: The organ fund is restricted – funds raised and donated specifically for the maintenance of the organ. The organ is used when schools come in, for some of our Christmas services, and at weddings and funerals occasionally.

Rich made special thanks to Grahame for all his hard work and to Gill for releasing him to do this work for the church.

(v) Elections of lay representatives to the PCC

a. Election of PCC representatives

The meeting paused to thank and pray for our outgoing PCC members, Sarah Kelsey, Bryan Mason and Purvi Wood. Steve Chase and Mike Croft have completed a three-year term.

- b. Election of 3 Deanery Synod Representatives

No-one stood for Deanery Synod. This falls to PCC to appoint a representative.

The meeting paused to pray for the new members and the work of the PCC in the next year.

(vi) Appointment of Independent Examiner for the year to December 2023

(vii) Questions

Rich invited everyone to ask questions. No questions raised.

(viii) Vicar's report

- a. Rich thanked the church as we have come through a 'vintage' year. He thanked all of us for leading in all sorts of ways and named all the ministries of the church. He gave special thanks to Sue Price as Parish Safeguarding Officer and Heather Christmas for shaping a culture of care within the church as part of the pastoral team. He gave special thanks for Kath for all she does to co-lead the church with him and his children for all the ways they give to the church as a family. He thanked the church for their support and for releasing Rich and Kath as they take up the national leadership role at New Wine this year.
- b. He shared reflections on 2022 as a transition year: the Big Weekend last summer thanking God for the first 20 years of the revitalised All Saints church, and the St Helen's re-ordering project underway under the supervision of Stella Power. It has been noticeable to see the church's collective commitment to ministry and community, our increased levels of prayer, and increased activity of the Holy Spirit.
- c. On the road ahead there are challenges, missional opportunities and this is a season to innovate, both in the future of the church and our financial challenges. We have big questions and some complex challenges to resolve around space, finance and structures to accommodate growth and release life.
- d. In staff team changes we will welcome an incoming Curate in June. We hope to appoint an Associate Vicar this term and Jo and Fraser are looking at a church plant opportunity for next year.
- Rich then gave an update on some of the developments and challenges in the Church of England around the Living in Love and Faith (LLF) process which sought to help the church engage carefully with questions of human sexuality and explore any implications for the doctrine and practice of the Church of England. He explained that LLF has proved highly contested – with some wanting to see the introduction of samesex marriage and others wanting to stick to the traditional teaching on marriage. Rich outlined that at the February meeting of General Synod, a motion proposing a way forward was brought by the House of Bishops. The House of Bishops made clear that the doctrine of marriage will not change. They are instead, proposing to introduce some prayers of blessing for people in committed, same-sex relationships but that these have not yet been finalised. Given the context of this, Rich recognised it was important to give clarity and pastoral reassurance on his theological convictions around this and that of the other clergy and what this means for All Saints going forward. He explained that they remain committed to the historic and orthodox doctrine. He reiterated that not everyone in All Saints holds the same view and recognised that many of us are grappling with these questions. He emphasised that there is room within All Saints for people who hold differing views and that he is confident and determined that we hold together in difference, in love. He invited anyone who has any questions or wanted to talk more to contact him or Fraser and added that this will help them think through how we engage together going forward.
- f. Rich moved on to our financial challenge and restated our goals. We aim to raise £80K in income this year: £50K in one-off gifts and £30K increase in regular giving. So far, we have raised £25k in one-off gifts and £5 increase in giving an amazing effort.
- g. He ended with a focus on our priority of prayer; this is what we can do! Pray for God's spirit to move. Kath and the prayer team are doing a great job in leading us to lean into prayer, and altogether there is more prayer happening in groups across the church. If there is one thing you commit to this year, may it be to the monthly Hungry prayer gatherings!

(ix) Closing prayer
